

As World Methodist Evangelism works to grow its impact, we, along with our partners around the world, continuously ask the questions What more can we do? and How can we better work in partnership to impact evangelism and share God's love and grace to all peoples?

We began looking at the concept of platform vs pipeline, and think we may be on to something! Pipelines are business models that create products, which they offer to consumers in a step-by-step process. The "producer" is in control of the process from beginning to end. Easy examples are Coke or Nike, or even colleges and universities.

WME has historically operated in a pipeline fashion. We create "products" – resources, events, etc. that we offer to others. We control the content and the various steps involved in distribution/participation. We are likely to always operate to some degree in this fashion, which is why it is important to critically evaluate the entire pipeline.

Platforms, however, are different. Platforms are designed to createan open, participative means of interaction between external producers and consumers. Platforms create an environment where users are matched to facilitate the exchange of goods, services, or social currency. Easy examples are Uber, Facebook or Airbnb.

World Methodist Evangelism will never be an entirely platform-based organization; however, we are a platform that connects the Wesleyan Methodist family in ways no one else can.

And one of our most exciting endeavors has been the creation of WE419, a digital community platform that is connecting the worldwide Wesleyan Methodist family.

#### WE'VE SEEN NEW RELATIONSHIPS GROW

Moving from a viewpoint of internal procedures to actually engaging external interaction, platforms create value by facilitating connections and bringing together producers and consumers in high-value exchanges.

The major asset in these new relationships is information and interactions, which together create the opportunity for great growth which generates value for both groups.

#### Partnerships in England to raise up young Christian leaders

World Methodist Evangelism's Emerging Leadership Director, Paulo Lopes, travelled to the UK in May to work on Metanoia planning and to connect with potential new partners. Previously, WME had mostly related to the British Methodist Church. Through this effort, we had the opportunity to develop four new strategic relationships, three of which are pictured here.



**Paulo met with the Advance team at The Message Trust,** one of the UK's largest ministry charities, and creators of Advance Groups, a small group curriculum strategy for believers interested in becoming more effective evangelists in their contexts.





Kim and Paulo are speaking at the London "Metanoia One Day", hosted in partnership with pastor Marcus D. Tillery and Ransom AME Zion, a historic congregation in Battersea (London). Thanks to our longstanding connections with AMEZ bishops in the US, we are now connected with the AME Zions of the London Midlands Conference.

The meeting was held at John Wesley's New Room where, after a meal and conversation about potential partnerships, they gathered at the pulpit to pray for a Wesleyan revival in the UK.

#### Romanian and Ukrainian partnerships for orphan and refugee support

When Ukraine was attacked, the world watched in horror as communities were destroyed, innocent people were injured and killed, and thousands sought refuge. As people fled their war-torn country, the church was there to receive them.



Rev. Cristian Istrate, one of our Eastern European partners, along with members of Light From Light Methodist Church in Sibiu, and others in the Romanian Methodist Church, worked to help families and orphaned children who had escaped the war.

Rev. Cristian and so many others just like you walked beside the Ukrainian people, sheltering them, befriending them, helping them navigate a different language, while trying to bring peace and understanding. You lovingly cared for them during this tragic time. This is our calling from Christ.



# WE'VE EXPANDED THE ORDER OF THE FLAME TO INCLUDE FLAME FELLOWS

When focusing on platform not pipeline, the focus moves from a customer-value standpoint to a focus on the network-value standpoint. Platforms seek to maximize the total value of an expanding network in a circular, iterative, feedback-driven process.



FLAME Fellows, a cohort-based program designed to cultivate pastoral leaders. With an emphasis on the holistic nature of evangelism and its interconnected relationship with other ministries of the church, this learning experience includes cross-denominational engagement, coaching, missional collaboration, and spiritual exploration. The design of the program and its focus on the importance of relationship works to deepen the spiritual stamina and insight necessary for continued productive and meaningful ministry and provides a means to address the burnout, loneliness, and frustration experienced by many clergy.

FLAME Fellows was born out of a commitment to being a platform, not a pipeline.



#### WE'VE ESTABLISHED A MEANS FOR GLOBAL CONNECTION

In a pipeline world, resources are seen as tangible assets, actual items. Whereas with platforms, the resources are essentially the community and the contributions through interaction that community provides. Platforms move us from resource control to resource orchestration.

Platforms have existed for years. Malls link consumers and merchants; newspapers connect subscribers and advertisers. Technology has profoundly reduced the need to own physical infrastructure and assets, and technology allows for participation that strengthens community and enhances the ability to share, discuss, and exchange resources – which increase the platform's value to everyone using it.



#### **WE419**

The creation of WE419 was to offer a place for people to connect. A true platform for Wesleyan Methodist believers to network and interact. A place to share resources as well as support each other and lift each other up. This platform allows articles, podcasts, blogs, chat groups, webinars, and other forms of resources and tools to be shared across our family of denominations.

The name WE419 points to World Evangelism (WE), to our connection to one another as the body of Christ (we), and to our calling to become fishers of people through the sharing of our faith (Matthew 4:19).
