

Our world is dramatically different than it was a few decades ago.

Technology and globalization have made us more connected, yet at the same time more divided. Societies all over the world are polarized by the forces of political ideology, secularism, economics, violence and religion.

In some parts of the world, such as Europe or North America, where Christianity once flourished, generations of young people are now growing up with little or no Christian memory. In other parts of the world, like Africa or South America, Christianity may be growing, but there are significant challenges such as oppression and persecution from other religions or political ideologies.

In light of these realities people need resources that encourage faithful discipleship and enable graceful faith sharing in secular environments where the church has lost its voice, and resources that speak to the pluralistic environments where Christianity is facing marginalization and oppression. Clergy need to be renewed in their understanding of the importance of evangelism and the way it intersects all the ministries of the church, and congregations need guidance, support, and encouragement in order to faithfully live out the gospel in contexts of disagreement, division, and difference.

The Program

Melding personal experience and theological integrity, *Embrace* is an evangelism resource that equips people to show and share the love of Jesus in a way that is authentic and natural. It sets out six essential values that lie at the heart of authentic faith-sharing: humility, clarity, prayer, integrity, worship, and urgency. These values remain constant no matter where in the world we live. Through the metaphor of embrace, Christ followers are offered a new way of envisioning our "stance" or "way of being in the world." Though our practices may change from place to place and time to time, no matter where we are or in what kind of culture we live, the values of embrace form the foundation for everything we do as we show and share the love of Jesus.





Embracing the Future

The Programs - Order of the FLAME & Metanoia

The Order of the FLAME (Faithful Leaders as Mission Evangelists) gathers young clergy and their spouses annually for holistic evangelism training, spiritual nurture, and encouragement. Each year promising young leaders from the various Wesleyan Methodist denominations are nominated to join a new class of the Order. As we gather at Epworth by the Sea on St. Simons Island, Georgia to welcome a new class, FLAME members experience four days of inspiring keynote speakers, informative break-out sessions, and meaningful small group experiences, while at the same time developing strong collegial relationships within and beyond their own denominational context.

We believe that it is of crucial importance to invest in clergy at the early stage of their ministry and find ways to continue that investment for increased fruitfulness and longevity in ministry. Our goals for FLAME members include a deepened understanding of the holistic nature of evangelism, a widened range of leadership skills, a broadened perspective on mission, and a heightened awareness of the importance of missional collaboration.

WME is blessed to currently have 2,440 members in the Order of the FLAME covenant community!

Metanoia is a transformative, faith strengthening, mission empowering, horizon expanding international gathering of young people age 18-35. Our goal is to:

- Deepen our spiritual roots so we are better able to show and share the love of Jesus Christ.
- Discover our place in the global community of believers and build relationships that extend beyond our own contexts and last long after we leave.
- Expand our vision of God's purpose for our lives and connect with others to make a difference in our world.

In 2018, building on the strength of ICYCE and emphasizing the importance of spiritual transformation, over 100 young people from over 20 countries gathered in Costa Rica to launch Metanoia.

- 20+ young people responded to a call to ministry
- Movement groups were formed to take action and raise awareness in response to issues like human trafficking, climate change, the black market selling of human organs, and homelessness.



The Programs - Convergence & RIM



Many people in today's world seem distant from the church, but still wrestle with the deep questions of meaning and purpose found in the Gospel. Convergence is designed for pastors and lay people interested in engaging in a post-Christian culture with the saving message of Jesus Christ. This two-week inaugural conference, scheduled for this September, will include teaching from a distinctly Wesleyan perspective. Scholars and practitioners from our global Methodist Wesleyan movement will help us explore how to best live out our faith in contexts and communities influenced by secularism, pluralism, and a post-Christian understanding of the world..



Residency in Missions (RIM) is an immersive mission and


evangelism experience designed for young adults who are called to serve beyond their home country in partnership with ministries in the Wesleyan Methodist family. RIM is a 9-12 month commitment that includes guided mentorship from mission and evangelism leadership experts. RIM also provides opportunities for host ministries to strengthen the work in their local context, while offering residents an environment in which to grow in their ministry service.

Our inaugural post will be in New Zealand.






